Ripon Cathedral continues to follow the guidance issued by the national church, which is regularly updated to take account of the most recent government advice. Consequently, it has been decided to continue to suspend the common cup (the chalice) at the administration of holy communion.

Following the Government's advice, the wearing of masks is encouraged when moving around the cathedral.

Welcome to this service

We welcome you to Ripon Cathedral on this Sunday as we celebrate the cathedral's Patronal Festival on the Sunday closest to our patron, St Wilfrid's Feast day, (12 Oct).

Wilfrid was born in Northumbria in about the year 633. He was educated at the monastery of Lindisfarne. As a teenager, Wilfrid journeyed to Canterbury and then to Rome. There, in the glorious basilicas, he discovered beautiful liturgy and music being offered to God's glory. He was inspired and enthused by all he saw and heard and was determined to share his vision back home.

He spent three years at Lyons where he was admitted as a monk. He was appointed Abbot here at Ripon and brought with him the Roman monastic system and Benedictine Rule, which he immediately introduced. At the Synod of Whitby, Wilfrid argued eloquently in favour of the Church in England being more clearly part of the universal Church rather than insular and isolated and cut off from the rest of the Christian family.

Wilfrid was elected Bishop of York, he went to Compiègne to be consecrated by twelve Frankish bishops rather than risk any doubt of schism by being ordained by Celtic bishops. There were upsets, first with Chad and then with Archbishop Theodore of Canterbury, but the Roman authorities took his side and he was eventually restored to his See. After further disputes, he resigned the See of York and became Bishop of Hexham, spending his remaining years in the monastery at Ripon.

Wilfrid was an energetic missionary and preacher of the Gospel, converting the people of Sussex to the faith, then journeying to Frisia and the Low Countries with Ripon monks to bring the light of Christ.

We honour one of our great patron saints today in this holy house which he founded. His shrine was the centre of pilgrimage and veneration until the Reformation and, in our day, many thousands of people come here each year to share the life of our Community, We pray that we may continue his work of building up God's Church in unity and faith and proclaiming the Good News of the Risen Christ in our generation.
